





LADIES SINGLES CHAMPION 2015 **ANNA BOWTELL**

CAPTURING the ladies' singles title in last year's Co Wicklow LTC Open will always hold an especially affectionate place in the memory bank of young Anna Bowtell.

After a number of outstanding runs in various tournaments, Anna finally succeeded in coming up trumps in a prestigious Tennis Ireland adult event – and at the tender age of just 16.

"Obviously it's very satisfying to win any title, but your first title is always that bit extra special," said Anna, who scored a 6-7 6-3 6-4 win over similarlyaged Jennifer Timotin from the Castleknock club in last year's final.

"In the previous year in Bray I had lost a tight semi-final match to (Ireland Fed Cup player) Rachael Dillon, and just a few weeks before last year's Bray final I had lost in the final of the Carrickmines Open to Sinead Lohan (winner of an ITF Women's Circuit title in Portugal in June). "As well, a few weeks before last year's Bray final Jennifer Timotin had beaten me in an ITE Under-18 Circuit tournament in Belfast, so it was great to turn the tables against her."

And Anna, who comes from nearby Delgany and whose elder sister Amy recently returned to the pro circuit after a nine-month hip injury absence, is really looking forward to defending her Co Wicklow Open title.

"It's never easy to win back-to-back titles, but hopefully I'll make a decent fist at attempting to go all the way again this year," said Amy, who is about to head into her Leaving Certificate year at St Gerard's School in Bray.

"But as well as playing in the tournament I really enjoy the atmosphere in the Bray club. All week long, the club is packed with enthusiastic tennis supporters wrapped in blankets to ward off the chilly August evenings, lounging on deck chairs and enjoying the superb food.

"And a major bonus for under-18 players taking part is that the Bray tournament is a super

warm-up tournament for the National under-age Championships which begin at Fitzwilliam the week after."

With her elder siblings Amy and Mark, who is a coach at the famed John McEnroe Tennis Academy in New York city, paving the way, it was not surprising that Anna found herself immersed in a tennis-orientated atmosphere from a very young age. "I was only five when I started to play at the Greystones Club and my Mum was always there with the four of us," she explained. "However, because he was 6f 7ins, my other brother Adam decided after a while to focus on rugby instead of tennis and he played with Greystones.

"As I was growing up, I was always looking at the trophies that the trophies that Mark (a former tennis scholarship student in the USA) and Amy had won in tournaments, and I suppose that helped to increase my interest and ambition in tennis to an even greater extent.

"At the age of 13, I won the National under-14 title and at 15 I won my first National Indoors under-18 title, which I successfully defended last year. As well, I have won the Leinster Grand Prix under-18 trophy for the last two years, and this year I made my Fed Cup debut (for Ireland in

Regarding her future tennis career, Anna has good reason to adopt a very optimistic approach. In addition to being honoured with selection on the Ireland adult women's team, she has made an extremely favourable and encouraging impact on the adult professional scene.

"I was excited to begin playing events on the pro circuit and I was thrilled that in my first tournament – in Cantanhede, in Portugal, in June this year – I scored a 6-7 6-3 6-4 win over Fernanda Brito, a player from Chile ranked 431," Anna enthused on the ITF Women's Circuit outdoor hardcourt event.

"That was in the final round of the qualifying draw and then in the first round of the main draw I ran Italy's Angelica Moratelli, who is ranked 449, to a 7-5 3-6 4-6 scoreline." After sitting for her Leaving Certificate, Anna is hoping to follow in the footsteps of her brother Mark by receiving an offer of a tennis scholarship from some university in the United States. "From September it is going to be a busy year for me, studying for my Leaving and trying to secure a tennis scholarship. I would love to play college tennis in the States, whilst getting a degree in accounting/finance."If I do go on a tennis scholarship, I will have to see how my game has progressed and judge whether my game is good enough to compete on the pro circuit like

Amy. If it is at the right level, I would love to play

professionally."

Mens Singles Champion 2015

DAVE O'HARE

FROM slugging it out against the long-time doubles world No 1s, the Bryan twins, to teaming up with the 2012 Wimbledon men's doubles champion, Dave O'Hare has certainly made massive strides since setting out on his pro tennis career just two years ago. Already, Dave has climbed to a very creditable 151st position in the doubles world rankings and, on the back of that achievement, he has set his sights on securing a place in the top 50 of the ATP ladder in the not-top-distant future.

But despite his consistent involvement in the upper echelons of the pro circuit, the 26-year-old right-hander still harbours a huge degree of regret that he hasn't been able to defend his singles and doubles titles in this year's Co Wicklow LTC Open. Speaking in early July, Dave said: "For the next five weeks I'll be playing in three Challenger tournaments in the US and two Challenger tournaments in Canada. "Unfortunately the date of the final tournament in Aptos, California clashes with the date of the Bray tournament and, as a result, unfortunately I won't be in Ireland at that stage.

"It's a shame that the Co Wicklow Open is not on the following week, as I would be home for that week, and I would love a chance to defend my title as last year was a fantastic tournament for me. "It was brilliant fun getting out there with my long term coach Owen Casey for the doubles, and I was really happy with how I played throughout the week on the singles court. "In the singles final I came up against a tough opponent in Osgar (O hOisin), and I did well to hang in there in the first set and fend off some break points to take my chances late in the set. In the second set I got an early break and I served out the rest of the match well," added Dave on his success against the Donnybrook club member. An additional reason for Dave, who also

completed a brace of Co
Wicklow Open title wins in
2014, to regret missing out on
another visit to Bray is the fact
that, as many people will be
aware, his elder brother
Mark is a member of our
club."Yes, Mark joined up
with Bray about three or
four years ago, and so it
would have been very

handy for him to give me a bit of vocal support if I had been able to play in the Co Wicklow Open again this year," Dave explained. "Although there's a significant age gap between Mark and myself that didn't stop me from trying to beat him in tennis when I was younger. It was a great test when I was growing up to play against Mark and my two other older siblings, Jenny and Simon."

As a youngster living with his family in the south Dublin suburb of Churchtown, situated between Dundrum and Rathfarnham, Dave vividly remembers possessing a major interest in tennis from a very young age.

"I played tennis since I was about three years of age, I'd say, but it was just casual as, like all kids, I played a multitude of sports growing up. In our house there was a very strong tennis culture as my parents, Alison and Joe, both played the sport. My mom is still very active in tennis and continues to play League tennis with the Templeogue club, but, while my dad still occasionally plays, he is now far more interested in golf.

"At the age of six, I became a member of the Templeogue club and I stayed there until I was 12 when I joined the Donnybrook club where I began working under Owen Casey, and which was convenient for me because I had begun at Colaiste Eoin near Stillorgan.

"During this time, I remember that I loved watching (three-time French Open champion) Gustavo Kuerten on the television playing in the various Grand Slams and he was a player whom I really admired and looked up to. He was seriously talented and had a savage one-handed backhand.

"When I was about 15 or 16 tennis started to dominate in the sports that I was playing and particularly when I got invited to train with the national squad out in DCU (Glasnevin). But I also played a couple of times a week with the squads that Owen Casey ran down in Donnybrook and to this day he is still involved with my career."

In the wake of completing his secondary schooling at Colaiste Eoin, Dave accepted an offer of a tennis scholarship from Memphis University in the United States, and it's a decision that he has never regretted for a minute. "I'd recommend any promising young tennis player to avail of a tennis scholarship in the States as it was definitely the best tennis experience I've ever had," stressed Dave, who achieved a college doubles ranking of 2 and a singles ranking of 50. "Several colleges had made offers to me but

taken on a recruiting trip there, and I really got along well with the coaches, and the facilities were world class. In fact, the college hosts two

I chose Memphis because I was

top tier ATP World Tour events each year.

"Everything about the scholarship was a major highlight, from representing my college, and being the first player to captain Memphis to win a Conference Championship, to all the people I met and all the friendships I made. Plus, I got to travel across America and played in nearly every state in the country."

However, despite his considerable impact in US college tennis, it was

far from being a foregone conclusion that Dave would try out his luck on the hugely-challenging pro tennis circuit once he had completed his four-year stint in Memphis University in the summer of 2014.

"Turning pro only became an option for me when I was coming towards the end of my time in college," he pointed out.

"In January 2014 I was fortunate enough to be selected for the Ireland Davis Cup team for the tie against Belarus, and I had an amazing experience in Minsk, with James Cluskey and myself pushing (former doubles world No 1) Max Mirnyi and his partner to five long sets. It was a brilliant match and the atmosphere was incredible.

"After that match it sparked my interest to play in front of a crowd of that size again. "Fortunately, a week later, I got a wild card into the main draw of the ATP 500 at Memphis where we (Dave was partnered by his Memphis teammate, Britain's Joe Salisbury) played the Bryan brothers in the first round.

"That was another amazing experience and I thought to myself that I should give the pro circuit a go, seeing as I had played so well against such established players."

Already this year, Dave has linked up in tournaments on five occasions with the 2012 Wimbledon men's doubles champion, Frederik Nielsen - who was partnered in his All-England triumph by Britain's Jonathan Marray, whose mother hails from Co Monaghan - the Irish-Danish duo winning the title in last month's ITF Futures event in Spain.

And explaining the background to that union, Dave said: "I had played against Freddy several times and I was lucky enough to practise with him a few times. So I just asked him if he would ever fancied the two of us playing together and fortunately he said 'yes'. So I'm just trying to learn as much as I can from him.

"As well, what James Cluskey did in reaching 145th position in the doubles world rankings was a tremendous achievement and that's a stepping stone of where I want to be. With another few years of experience and continued hard work I want to be playing in the Grand Slams and to break into the top 50 of the doubles rankings."
